iNaturalist Guidance

We need to try to be consistent in our reporting of field research opportunities like iNaturalist and eBird. Basically, observations should only occur during approved opportunities (rather than merely making incidental observations) and volunteers can record time for the actual entry into the database, but not for the travel or observation time. Generally, chapters allow 15 minutes for data recording per day, but your individual situation may vary.

Field in Focus: Impact Data...

A couple of questions have come up recently about impact data and the discrepancies between the survey and the grids.

So put on your time-travel hat and go back to 2018. If you remember, we had a dozen or more different fields to put in impact data (adult-Hispanic, youth-Hispanic, female-Hispanic, male-Hispanic, etc.). We worked with TPWD & AgriLife to see what the bare minimum amount of data was that they required. We settled on what you see in the survey - basically one set for gender, one set for age and one set for ethnicity. However, we couldn't change the field names in the system, so we had to put everything in the adult field for each set. That's why, when you look at the grid all of the data ends up in the adult field name for that set.

Also remember, that the survey doesn't have the capacity to do math, so we removed the Grand Total field from the survey to prevent confusion.

If you need to collect specific impact data for a partner at an event and the VMS data isn't as granulated as they need it to be, you'll have to keep that tally in a spreadsheet or separate system.

NASA is getting ready for the Eclipse - are you?

This is an all-volunteer group that will be learning about the upcoming solar eclipses, and how to collect data to help NASA better understand eclipses and how they impact birds, insects, and other living things. They have a "StoryMap" you can look at that is going to serve as the virtual textbook and filing cabinet, and as well as BaseCamp which will be how to collaborate and know what the schedule is for the biweekly email and monthly webinar.
